What is Rugby?

Rugby is a sport that has been played for over 100 years, it is one of the most popular sports in the world, second only to soccer. The Rugby World Cup is the third largest sporting event in the world, behind the Olympics and Futbol World Cup. The game is played between two teams of 15 players and two 40 minute halves. Rugby is more similar to football than soccer, and is a full-contact sport played without padded uniforms. While rugby is similar to football, it does not have substitution, blocking, and you have to pass the ball lateral or kick it to advance the ball.

In less than five years, the club was promoted to Division I, the top competitive division, and has become one of the dominant women's rugby programs in the country.
